# ST. MARY'S RIVER ASSOCIATION NOTES TO FINANCIAL INFORMATION (Unaudited - See Compilation Engagement Report) March 31, 2023

St. Mary's River Association ("SMRA") operates programs aimed at Atlantic Salmon protection and conservation, habitat restoration, and public education through an Interpretive Centre. The organization is incorporated under the Societies Act as a not-for-proft organization.

## 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of presentation

The basis of accounting applied in the preparation of the balance sheet of St. Mary's River Association as at March 31, 2023 and the income statement for the year then ended is on the historical cost basis, reflecting cash transactions. Further details on specific accounting policies are as follows:

### Revenue recognition

Membership fees are recognized as contributions as they are non-refundable and do not relate directly to the services provided.

The Organization recognizes government funding in the period in which it is received.

The Organization recognizes contributions of materials and services only when a fair value can be reasonably estimated and when the materials and services are used in the normal course of the Organization's operations and would otherwise have been purchased.

Pledges are not recognized until collected, as the Organization cannot make a reasonable estimate of the amount that will be collected and collection is not reasonably assured.

#### Assets

The organization owns and operates the Interpretive Centre, however, it is located on municipal land and therefore is not recognized in the financial statements. The most recent property valuation completed, assessed the land at \$156,400.

#### Income taxes

The organization is exempt from income taxes as a registered charity under the Income Tax Act.

#### Financial Instruments

Financial assets and liabilities for which fair value is readily obtainable are disclosed at fair value.

## 2. CANADIAN EMERGENCY BUSINESS ACCOUNT (CEBA) LOAN

The Association applied for and received approval for a \$60,000 Line of Credit with the Royal Bank of Canada, through the Canada Emergency Business Account program. If 67% of the program loan value is repaid prior to December 31, 2023, the remaining 33% of the loan will be forgiven. \$20,000, which represents the forgivable portion of the advanced amount, has been recorded in a prior year as part of the grants revenue. The loan is interest free until January 1, 2024.

#### 3. GRANTS

## a) Coastal Restoration Fund

The Coastal Restoration Fund grant of \$1,200,000 is a three year program with the money sent to SMRA over a three year period. The Department of Fisheries and Oceans released the final holdback payment of \$22,800 which was received by SMRA in February 2023.

The Coastal Restoration Fund project required the purchase of equipment including water monitoring probes and PH meters which totaled \$46,500.

## b) Recovery Fund for Heritage Organizations - Museums Assistance Program

The association received a grant from the Department of Culture, History and Sport in December 2022 for \$8000.

## c) Other grants and contributions

The balance of the grants revenue consists of contributions for the restoration of river habitat projects from organizations including the Nova Scotia Salmon Association and the Atlantic Salmon Conservation Foundation.

#### 4. NOPE CAMPAIGN

The NOPE campaign grants and donations received are included in the revenue figures. As of March 31, 2023 the NOPE campaign held a balance of \$11,892.07.

#### 5. DONATIONS FOR EDUCATION

Included in cash is \$9,703 from donations, that is to be spent specifically on educational endeavours.
