ST. MARY'S RIVER ASSOCIATION NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (Unaudited)

March 31, 2021

St. Mary's River Association operates programs aimed at salmon protection and conservation, habitat restoration, and public education through an Interpretive Centre. The organization is incorporated under the Societies Act as a not-for-profit organization.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of presentation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

Revenue recognition

Membership fees are recognized as contributions as they are non-refundable and do not relate directly to the services provided.

The Organization recognizes government funding in the period in which it is received.

The Organization recognizes contributions of materials and services only when a fair value can be reasonably estimated and when the materials and services are used in the normal course of the Organization's operations and would otherwise have been purchased.

Pledges are not recognized until collected, as the Organization cannot make a reasonable estimate of the amount that will be collected and collection is not reasonably assured.

Assets

The organization owns and operates the Interpretive Centre, however, it is located on municipal land and therefore is not recognized in the financial statements. The most recent property valuation completed, assessed the land at \$148,700.

Income taxes

The organization is exempt from income taxes as a registered charity under the Income Tax Act.

Financial Instruments

Financial assets and liabilities for which fair value is readily obtainable are disclosed at fair value.

2. CANADIAN EMERGENCY BUSINESS ACCOUNT (CEBA) LOAN

The Association applied for and received approval for a \$60,000 Line of Credit with the Royal Bank of Canada, through the Canada Emergency Business Account program. If 67% of the program loan value is repaid prior to December 31, 2022, the remaining 33% of the loan will be forgiven. \$20,000, which represents the foregivable portion of the advanced amount, has been recorded in the current year as part of the grants revenue. The loan is interest free until January 1, 2023.

3. GRANTS

a) Coastal Restoration Fund

The Coastal Restoration Fund grant of \$1,200,000 is a three year program with the money sent to SMRA over a three year period. An installment of \$594,000 was received for the second year of funding, as well as \$31,200 which represents the holdback from the prior year. A total of \$906,000 in funding has been released which represents approximately 75% of the total project approval. A 10% holdback in the amount of \$66,000 will be forwarded to SMRA when required reporting is complete, and approved by the Department of Fisheries and Oceans.

The Coastal Restoration Fund project required the purchase of equipment including water monitoring probes and PH meters which totaled \$46.500.

b) Canadian Heritage

The association received a grant from the Department of Canadian Heritage in October, 2020 for \$42,708.

c) Other grants and contributions

The balance of the grants revenue consists of the foregivable portion of the CEBA loan as noted above, and contributions for the restoration of river habitat projects from organizations including the Nova Scotia Salmon Association and the Atlantic Salmon Conservation Foundation.

4. NOPE CAMPAIGN

The NOPE campaign grants and donations received are included in the revenue figures. As of March 31, 2021 the NOPE campaign held a balance of \$17,575.
